Join 1,000 West Midlands Clean Up Volunteers this Summer



West Midlands Combined Authority has partnered with environmental charity, <u>Keep Britain Tidy</u>, to host The West Midlands Great Clean Up, ahead of welcoming up to one million sports fans and the world's media to the region for the 2022 Commonwealth Games.

With 20 clean-up events planned across seven local authorities, the aim is to tackle litter on our streets and in our waterways in both urban and rural areas. Local residents, visitors, volunteer groups, schools, colleges, businesses, youth and faith groups are all invited to be

part of the 1,000 #LitterHeroes who will be joining forces across the West Midlands.

Love Solihull is supporting this regional event by hosting a litter pick at Babbs Mill Park and Local Nature Reserve on Saturday 25 June between 10am to 12pm.

Babbs Mill, one of the Council's 16 <u>Green Flag</u> Parks, is located in Kingshurst, North Solihull and features a large lake, playground and skatepark with the beautiful River Cole meandering

through. The park also features as a key location on the Queen's Baton Relay route, when it begins its journey through Solihull on Tuesday 26 July.

For the clean-up, #LitterHeroes will assemble at the park's basketball court, where they will be provided with all the equipment needed to take part in looking after this beautiful outdoor facility.

First-time litter pickers, as well as regulars, are all welcome to attend and advised to register attendance <u>online</u>. Children are also welcome and should be accompanied by a registering adult.

On Friday 20 May 2022, the Council's Public Realm Team helped organise a fantastic event to celebrate the official opening of the Armed Forces Community Garden in Hillfield Park.

The garden, designed in collaboration with the Warwickshire & Birmingham County Royal British Legion, offers a natural

environment which promotes the wellbeing of the Armed Forces community through naturebased activities.

The opening event saw more than 100 invited guests descend on the park, with Veterans and serving members of the Armed Forces present to see the formal unveiling of the archway and hear the remarkable stories of those impacted by combat and PTSD.

The garden was officially opened by the Vice Lord Lieutenant of the West Midlands, Professor Helen Higson OBE; the Mayor of Solihull, Councillor Ken Meeson; the President of Warwickshire and Birmingham County Royal British Legion (RBL), Elaine Butler; and six Armed Forces Veterans.

The Public Realm Team, who are responsible for parks, open spaces and allotments, and manages campaigns such as Love Solihull and Planting Our Future, were supported by various organisations and community groups, including Friends of Hillfield Park, who all helped to make the event a huge success. With musical entertainment from the Bugaloo Babes, City of Birmingham Brass Band, Chandos Choir of Solihull and children from Monkspath School, the afternoon was rounded off with a traditional afternoon tea for the guests.

BNP Paribas UK volunteer at Monkspath School



<u>BNP Paribas UK</u> recently took part in a community project at Monkspath Junior and Infant School, as part of their corporate social responsibility pledge, which gives each staff member the opportunity to give at least one day of volunteering per year.

The group of Marketing colleagues, based at the Solihull office, got in touch with Love Solihull to offer their support and were paired up with the school who had plans to regenerate their garden area, and needed

support to make this a reality.

Love Solihull visited Monkspath School earlier in the year to meet with Sharon O'Keefe, the school's eco-leader, as well as two children from the eco-club to discuss their vision for the garden.

The children decided to remove the garden's large disused polytunnel which had become overtaken by bramble, to make way for more plants which encourage biodiversity and attract different wildlife species. The children eventually would like the area to be a sanctuary where pupils can relax and enjoy the nature on offer in a safe environment, including natural seating and animal habitats.

The team from BNP Paribas UK met with Love Solihull on-site in May to start work by first cutting back overgrown vegetation and then carefully dismantling the polytunnel, which the school found a new owner for, ensuring it would be reused, rather than ending up in landfill.

It was a warm day with a mixture of sunshine and showers, and the team worked very hard to ensure the school now has a space where they can begin work on their new garden.

BBC Gardener's World Live school wheelbarrow competition



To celebrate the arrival of the Commonwealth Games in the West Midlands, schools across the region were recently invited to take part in a <u>competition</u> to plant a wheelbarrow which represents one of the 54 Commonwealth Countries.

Schools were tasked with looking at the flora and fauna, garden styles, national heritage, cuisine and cultures from the country to inspire their design, and were particularly encouraged to take a lead from the edibles of their chosen country.

A number of Solihull schools have taken part, with all the entries going on display at the BBC Gardener's World Live show which is due to take place between 16 to 19 June 2022 at Birmingham NEC, where the winners will be announced and prizes awarded.

We are very excited to see the entries from the following Solihull schools, including:

The day will be marked by numerous community celebrations and events along the route.

The visit of the Queen's Baton Relay to Solihull and the rest of the West Midlands region will be the culmination of a journey which brings together and celebrates communities across the Commonwealth during the build up to the Games.

As the Queen's Baton Relay tours around the borough, it will visit Babbs Mill Park, Lavender Hall Park, Hope Coppice and Shirley Park, and will see community events taking place at each location.

Meet The Funder - Community Green Grants



West Midlands Combined Authority (WMCA) are keen to see more applications from groups or individuals in Solihull for the <u>Community Green Grants</u> scheme.

The funding is intended for projects that will increase people's access to nature by improving green spaces or enhancing the local environment. Grants of between

£3,000 - £25,000 and £25,000 - £100,000 are available.

WMCA and <u>Warwickshire CAVA</u> will host a virtual workshop, giving you the chance to find out more about how the grants can be used and what makes a good application.

The virtual event will take place on Wednesday 29 June between 5-6pm

Free Nature & Wellbeing sessions offered by Warwickshire Wildlife Trust

Our friends over at <u>Warwickshire Wildlife Trust</u> will be hosting four free sessions aimed at people who may be experiencing loneliness or social isolation, where you can learn about nature and wildlife, and how to harness nature as a tool for positive wellbeing.

All sessions will be based at Hams Hall Environmental Centre (B46 1GA) with free parking and accessible facilities are available on site.

You can attend as many or as few activities as you like. All sessions are suitable for beginners and remember to register online as places are limited.

Session 1: Thursday 11 August - try a guided walk around the local woodland and surrounding area to explore green spaces and how nature can be used for wellbeing

Session 2: Saturday 13 August - have a go at wildlife identification and take a look at the pond and garden.

Session 3: Tuesday 16 August - take part in practical conservation work around the local area, learning how to use hand tools and helping manage habitats for wildlife.

Session 4: Thursday 18 August - join the group to try some crafting activities, using natural materials to make tools and create art.
